Date: November 13th, 2021


“Winkles will only go where the smile have been”




NSS SPECIAL CAMP TANDULWADI




Volunteers also learned a lot about children with special needs as they interacted with the representative from Happy Hours Workshop.


Happy Hours Stalls for Friendship day and RakshaBandhan



Procedure for All Scholarships and Freeship applications processing at Institute level is as follows.


Government of Maharashtra has different scholarships schemes as follows

- SC,ST,VJNT,SBC FREESHIP (100% tuition fees is refunded by Gov. Of Maharashtra)
- SC ,ST,VJNT ,SBC Scholarship(100% tuition fees is refunded by Gov. Of Maharashtra +maintenance allowances)
- OBC SCHOLARSHIP(50% tuition fees is refunded by Gov. Of Maharashtra +maintenance allowances)
- OBC FREESHIP(50% tuition fees is refunded by Gov. Of Maharashtra)
- MINORITY SCHOLARSHIP(Fixed amount of 25000/- refunded by DTE)
- EBC SCHOLARSHIP(50% tuition fees is refunded by DTE)

Institute accepts fees from students in the above category (except EBC ad MINORITY)only as per above terms. In case of EBC and Minority full fees is collected and then government credits scholarship amount to their account.

1. Students will apply online on website <https://mahadbtmahait.gov.in> for therespective schemes through student login.
2. Those applications are viewed by institute login on same website.
3. All the required documents are scrutinized at two levels .First at clerical level andsecond at the Principal level.
4. After verification of all documents form is accepted and forwarded to respective department through MAHADBT website itself.
5. After verification by SOCIAL WELFAIR DEPARTMENT of MAHARASHTRA and Directorate of Technical Education, Maharashtra students are awarded with scholarship, Freeship or minority scholarship.
6. List of the students is generated from website as a bill for different scholarshipschemes.
7. Amount for the minority and EBC scholarship is directly deposited in students' bankaccount.
8. Amount for other schemes related to OBC, SBC, and VJNT, SC etc is deposited incollege account.








Following were the Judges for the Finals of CRMD' 21 -



Bandra Fair Crowd Management Volunteering



Altogether, the session proved to be thoroughly educative, informative and helpful. At the end of the webinar the attendance and feedback of all attendees was recorded.





REPORT ON TREE PLANTATION AT ST. JOSEPH








Figure 2 Poster of the event




Figure 3 Volunteers in action

REPORT ON DOG SAFETY





The session mainly focused on ways how these accidents could be avoided. One of these ways is using Radium Collars. These reflective collars help the drivers to notice these street dogs while driving in the dark. Mr. ~~Jatin~~ explained the volunteers how these collars were to be tied around the dogs and how these dogs could be approached in case the dogs are scared of us. He also explained what could be done if one comes across in injured dog or any animal for that matter.

The session commenced by defining the objectives of the seminar.The speaker started the session as a dialogue between her and the participants and following points were discussed in the session by the speaker.

Need for Value Education

All human beings aspire for a happy, fulfilling life. For a human being, there are two important questions pertaining to this:

- What is my aspiration? (What to do?)
- How to fulfill my aspiration? (How to do?)

The purpose of education is to facilitate the development of clarity on the aspiration and adequate competence to actualize it.For this, it is essential to understand what a happy, fulfilling and successful life is – what is really valuable for human beings; what is our purpose as a human being?

Understanding human aspiration, what is really valuable for human beings, is the value domain. The subject which enables us to understand this domain is called 'Value Education' (VE). It enables us to understand our aspirations and visualise our goals for a fulfilling life and indicates the direction for their fulfillment. In relation to these issues,

It also helps to remove our confusions and contradictions. In that sense, VE addresses the issues related to 'what to do?'

It is also necessary to learn the skills to actualise our aspirations. This is the skill domain. The subject which enables us to learn the skills is called 'Skill Development' (SD). It enables us to learn science, technology, management and other skills for fulfilling our aspirations. In that sense, SD addresses the issues related to 'how to do?'

Values and skills go hand in hand. Both values and skills are required. There is an essential complementarity between the two. The priority is values, then skills; i.e. first understanding 'what to do' and then developing the skills for 'how to do'. And of course, checking if this results into a fulfilling life! The present education system has largely become skill-biased. For developing skills, the prime emphasis is on science and technology, without a base of values.



PAUSE & THINK

Skills can only help to provide the means to achieve what is considered valuable. It is not within the scope of science and technology to provide a way to decide what really is valuable. The consequence of skill-biased education is clearly visible in the form of serious crises at the individual, societal and environmental level. Thus, there is a strong need to rectify this situation. Value education is a crucial



missing link in the present education system. But more importantly, the prime need of value education is to understand human aspirations, to discover what is truly valuable in life; and work out the program for its fulfillment.

Continuous Happiness and Prosperity as Basic Human Aspirations

The answers are in affirmative yes. We have a natural acceptance for the continuity of happiness and prosperity. These are our basic aspirations.


Right Understanding, Relationship and Physical Facility

Human beings want to live with continuous happiness and prosperity and this is possible by ensuring right understanding, fulfilment in relationships and physical facility in the correct priority. This is living with 'human consciousness'.

On the other hand, if one is living for physical facility alone, and not ensuring the right understanding and right feeling in a relationship, s(he) feels unhappy and makes others unhappy too. This is one outcome.

The other outcome is that if the right understanding is missing, one is not able to identify the need for physical facility. Now, if we are not able to identify our need for physical facility then regardless of how much physical facility we accumulate, we never feel that we have enough. We keep wanting more. This feeling of not having enough is the feeling of deprivation. As a result, one is deprived, exploiting and depriving others. While physical facility alone may suffice for animals, it is not adequate for human being to be fulfilled.

The role of education is essentially to facilitate holistic development, i.e. the individual transformation to human consciousness as well as the societal transformation to a humane society.






What is Self-exploration?

It is a process of seeing the reality in our own right, by our own investigation, observation and analysis. Through this process, we are trying to understand the reality that exists and our participation with it; this participation is what we are calling values. The first step is to verify the given proposal on your own right, by referring it to your 'natural acceptance'. If the proposal is naturally acceptable to you, it is right for you. If it is not naturally acceptable to you, it is not right for you. Further, self-exploration is a process of dialogue. To begin with, it is initiated as a dialogue between us and you. This course systematically presents a series of proposals for your exploration. As you explore, you try to verify the proposals and start asking these questions to yourself. Then, it turns into a dialogue within your own Self. The Dialogue Within It is a dialogue between "what I am" and "what is naturally acceptable to me".

Prevailing Notions of Prosperity

By and large, there is confusion between accumulation of physical facility and the feeling of prosperity.

It is generally assumed that the richer you are, the more prosperous you are, i.e. the more you have accumulated, the more prosperous you are. With this sort of assumption, we pursue prosperity with an obsession for profit, for accumulation. That is happening all around. The major focus in society today is on accumulation of physical facilities. In particular, there is a major focus on accumulating money. Today, most of the wealth (money) in the world is owned by a very tiny percentage of

people. Many such people are seen exploiting others, and exploiting the Earth, in an effort to accumulate even more. Without clarity about how much is required, the effort is for an unlimited quantity of physical facility, and by almost any means. First the efforts may be by legal means, and then slip to even illegal means. This is all because the quantity required is undefined and there is a feeling of deprivation!

Key Takeaways

Happiness is to be in a state of harmony. The expanse of our living is at four levels (individual human being, family, society and nature/existence), and thus the program for continuity of happiness is to be in harmony at all these levels. Prosperity is the feeling of having more than required physical facility.

Key Takeaways

Self-exploration is a process of seeing the reality on our own right, by our own investigation, observation and analysis. It is a process of dialogue between “what I am” and “what is naturally acceptable to me”. It includes verifying the proposals on the basis of natural acceptance (which is not the same as acceptance) and validating experientially in living.

Key Takeaways

The prime need of value education is to understand human aspirations, to discover what is truly valuable (human value) in life. Value of any entity is its participation in the larger order of which it is a part. The value of human being is their participation towards mutual fulfillment (harmony) starting from within themselves, then extending in their family, in the society and in nature. The content of value education has to be universal, rational, natural, verifiable and leading to harmony. The process of value education has to be a process of self-exploration, rather than being prescriptive.

The basic aspiration of a human being is continuity of happiness and prosperity. To fulfil this, three things are required in order of priority: right understanding, relationship and physical facility, and one cannot be substituted for the other. Human consciousness is living with continuous happiness and prosperity by ensuring right understanding, fulfilment in relationship and physical facility in the correct priority. Holistic development is the transformation from animal consciousness to human consciousness. Education-sanskar has the most significant role to play in this transformation.
